Statutory Authority (Summary)

16.618, Florida Statutes

(1) The Department of Legal Affairs shall establish a direct-support organization to provide assistance, funding, and support to the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking and to assist in the fulfillment of the council's purposes.

The direct-support organization must be:

(a) A Florida corporation, not for profit, incorporated under chapter 617, and approved by the Secretary of State.

(b) Organized and operated exclusively to solicit funds; request and receive grants, gifts, and bequests of money; acquire, receive, hold, invest, and administer, in its own name, property and funds; and make expenditures in support of the purposes specified in this section; and

(c) Certified by the department, after review, to be operating in a manner consistent with the purposes of the organization and in the best interests of this state.

Brief Description of the Mission and Results Obtained by the Organization

The Florida Alliance to End Human Trafficking is a nonprofit organization created by the Florida Legislature to provide funding, support, and assistance to the statewide effort to end human trafficking.

During Fiscal Year 2025-2026, Florida Alliance to End Human Trafficking developed and executed the following:

- Held four meetings of the Board of Directors.
- Trained over 20,000 individuals with its online human trafficking awareness course (over 76,000 to date) from various industries: including hotel, motel, vacation rentals, trucking and logistics, property management, service providers, statewide associations, state/local government agencies, universities, and real estate.
- Supported and promoted the 100 Percent Club (human trafficking awareness challenge to businesses/organizations).
 - 95 companies have completed the application.
 - 69 companies have received their certificate of completion.¹

- Issued grant opportunities from private fundraising to support law enforcement's use of technology solutions to identify victims to initiate cases, investigations, and rescue victims.
 - Funded grants to the following agencies: Boca Raton Police Department (\$21,006.00), Broward Sheriff's Office (\$64,600.00), Pinellas Park Police Department (\$28,340.00), and Polk County Sheriff's Office (\$135,000.00).
 - Requested and received approval from the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking in January 2026 to issue a Grants Solicitation for service providers during FY 2026-2027.
- Provided six different awareness trainings for various organizations.
- Continued outreach of potential donors, community partners, and supporters.
- Fundraised \$440,465.47 in private contributions.
 - Including a local and national foundation, event sponsorships, individual philanthropic gifts, and anonymous online donations.
 - Hosted a fundraising gala *A Night of Hope and Healing* (May 2026).
- Updated corporate and individual annual giving plans.



Brief Description of the Organization's Plans for the Next Three Fiscal Years

During the upcoming fiscal years, the Florida Alliance to End Human Trafficking is focused on the following initiatives:

- Host fundraising events to provide funding, support, and assistance to the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking.
- Collaborate with the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking to update the organization's training resources.
- Provide grant funding opportunities for law enforcement and service providers as they work to identify, recover, and stabilize victims of human trafficking.
- Update and expand its public awareness materials to ensure Floridians have current, accessible resources that promote prevention, increase recognition of human trafficking, and encourage appropriate reporting.
